For all other violations of state or local statutes, regulations, or ordinances occurring within the purview of the National Park Service which are adopted by the United States pursuant to the Assimilative Crimes Act or other lawful authority and which are not specifically set forth in Exhibit 1, the collateral to be set or the mandatory appearance to be required shall be determined by any duly approved state schedule authorized by the appropriate state authority. In the event that the offense to be charged is not set forth in a state schedule, the collateral to be set shall be
